

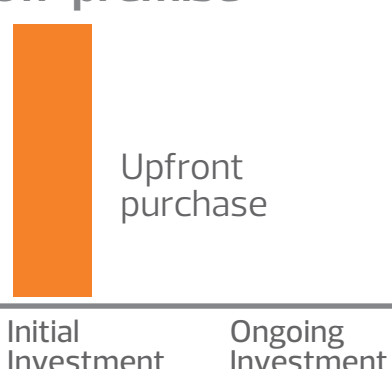

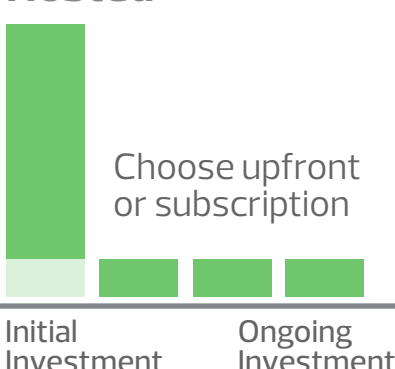
Licensing

ERP licensing is generally based on user counts and/or functional modules. A test environment may or may not be included in the pricing.

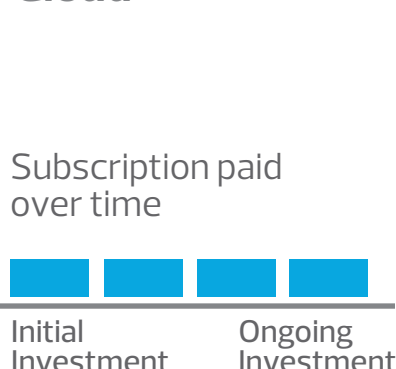

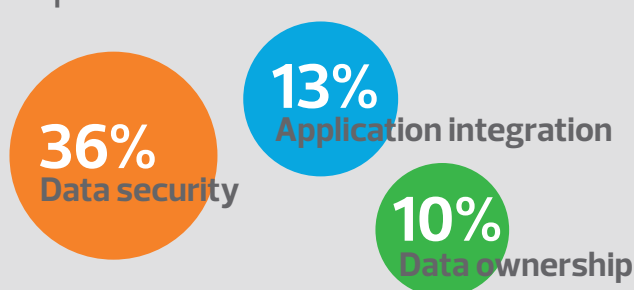
Maintenance

Maintaining top performance and up-to-date functionality are essential elements in realizing the full value of an ERP system.

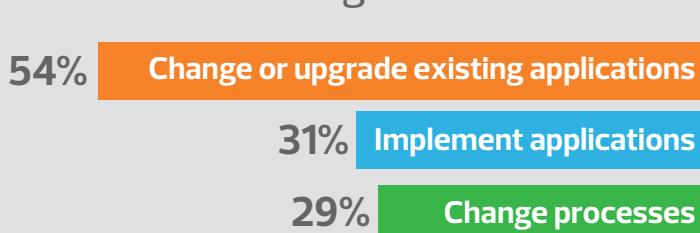

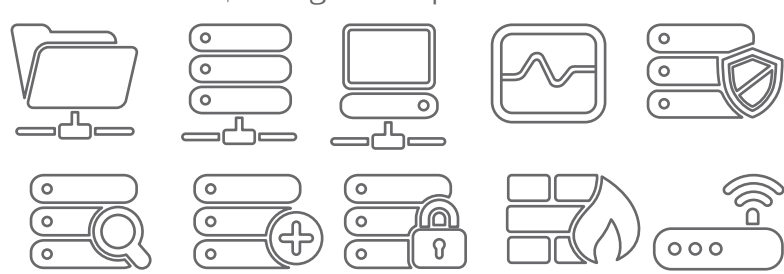


Platform

Included in hosting fee or subscription



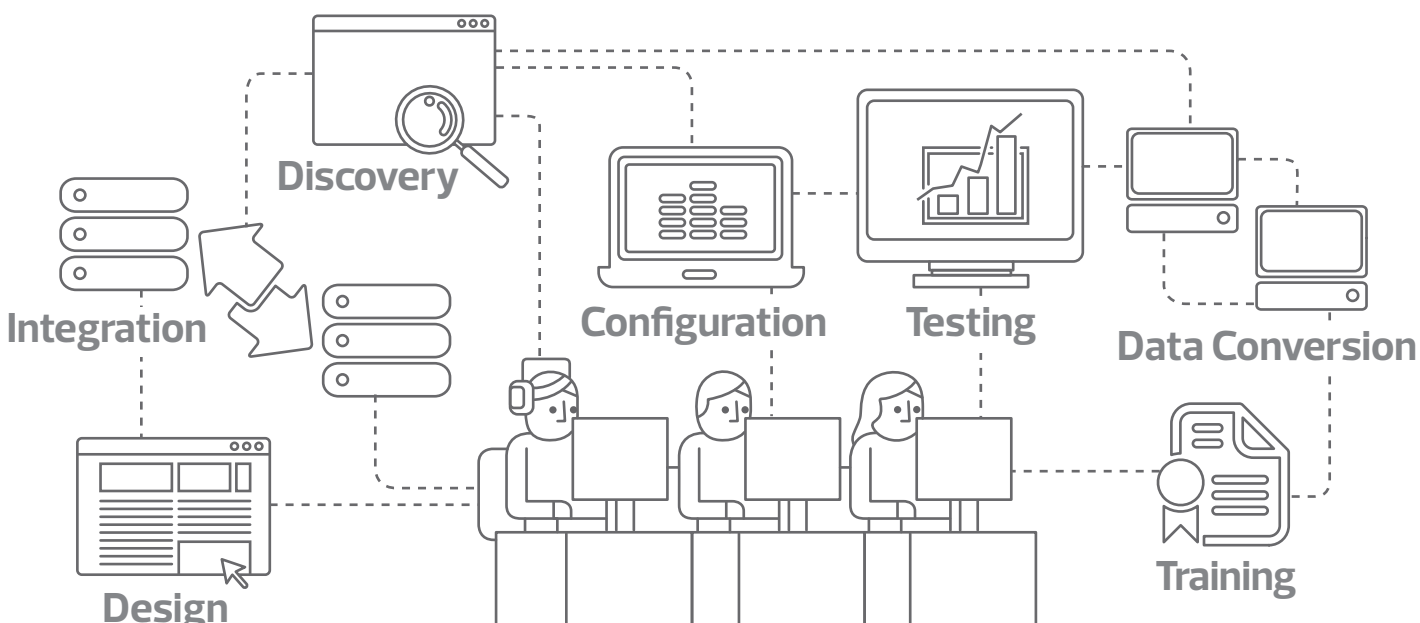
